> **Exploring the Mass** Deacon Kenneth continues his reflections on the Mass.

> Liturgy of the Word: This is where the table of God's Word is spread. When the Sacred Scriptures are read in the Church, God himself speaks to his people, and Christ, present in his word, proclaims the Gospel. Therefore, the readings from the Word of God are to be listened to reverently by everyone; it is to each one of us that the Lord's Word is directed. Through the readings, we hear the teaching of the Church, first as that teaching has been received from the Apostles or prophetically declared in the inspired books of the Old Testament, and later in the words of Jesus himself in the Gospel. In the Gospel Christ himself comes to teach us by the example of his life and his own words. He comes to teach us what to believe and what to do. This teaching is explained to us in the homily/sermon. The whole purpose of the sermon which follows the Gospel proclamation lies in nothing other than an attempt to develop, to explain, to comment upon the Lord's words, that in those words our minds may find enlightenment and our hearts enrichment. The substance of this teaching is summed up in the Creed, Credo, which we all recite by way of affirming our assent to it, that we believe with all the strength of our being all that the Lord has come to teach us.
