Exploring the Mass: Reception of Holy Communion Unless one is incapacitated in some way, we must all come solemnly toward the altar to receive the Lord, coming to the Lord in the procession. If one is unable to kneel to receive the Lord, they must make a profound bow or genuflection before receiving the Lord as a sign of profound reverence for the Almighty and living Lord now here present before us and who desires to come to us, sinful and unworthy though we are to receive him. In Holy Communion we totally surrender ourselves, completely and entirely to God in order to be ennobled and enriched; we give up our nothingness and we receive all, we receive Divine life from God. Christ receives us, incorporating us into himself. We know we do not deserve this and always lowering ourselves on our knees, conscious of the fact that we are unworthy of this Divine gift, we acknowledge, "Domine non sum dignus" by kneeling, or making a profound bow, or genuflect. · Post Holy Communion and concluding Rite: once you return to your place, if able, please kneel in thanksgiving and then join in the thanksgiving hymn in preparation for the final blessings. · Post Mass: It is strongly encouraged that we spend a short time after Mass in thanksgiving and to leave the church in silence, also another opportunity to light a candle. It is time to give thanks to God for this wonderous gift of himself we have undeservedly received and reflect on how the meaning and benefits of the Mass we have celebrated will be realised in our lives with our neighbours. It is important to look at this Mass as a happy oasis to our lives so that with a right heart, we may resume our daily lives, conscious of the Lord's loving kindness and indulgent aid in which even the burdens which we often find beyond bearing may be made light. It is also time to beg the Lord to lead us henceforth along the way in which we should go. It is also a time that we may wish to avoid unnecessary work or shopping, so we have dedicated the Lord's day to the Lord!
