


My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, today we celebrate the second Sunday of Easter, this Sunday is known as the DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY. The readings of this Sunday reflect God's mercy through the forgiveness of sins. The openina verv prayer addresses the father as "God of Mercy". everlasting In responsorial Psalm, we repeat several times "give thanks to the Lord for He is good, his love is everlasting." In another translation it reads, " His mercy endures forever ". God revealed his mercy first and foremost by sending his Son to save us through his suffering, death. and resurrection.

In our Gospel reading today we heard that when Jesus resurrected and appeared to his disciples, the first gift he gave them was the gift of peace through the forgiveness of sins. Jesus said to them, "peace be with you " and he breathed onto them and said,

"Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them. and whose sins you retain are retained ". By this gesture Jesus Christ instituted the Sacrament of Reconciliation to bestow his mercy upon us his beloved children. The confessional therefore becomes the throne of God's mercy, Grace and Healing.

Furthermore, the attitude of Jesus to his Apostle Thomas in our Gospel is a further proof of God's mercy and love. When Thomas doubted the fact of the risen Lord and his appearance to the other disciples. God gave him a second chance so that he may no longer be unbelieving but a believer. Today, we still have many people doubting who are still existence of God, those who don't believe that God loves them. However, the liturgies of Holy Week which we have just celebrated, especially Good Friday and the Easter Vigil, do remind us not only of the Love of



God the Father but of his mercy revealed to us in Christ.
