

Beloved friends in Christ, the Lord Jesus' words in today's Gospel reading are very familiar, we have heard them a hundred times, "Love one another as I have loved you, that all people will know that you are my disciples". We can reflect on these wellknown words of Christ from the Last Supper.

What is it in "NAME" that people must know who we are? And why do we fight to protect and preserve our name and reputation? Names and titles can trigger certain reactions. Some names become stereotypes. When we hear that someone is Irish, Scottish, French, British, African, American, Asian or when we hear of worktitles like related doctor. accountant, actor, actress, priest, bishop or pope certain feelings and expectations are evoked about what that individual will be like. In proverbs 22:1 we read, "a good name is more desirable than great riches, to be esteemed is better than silver or gold ".

What do people today think when they hear the name Christian? What should Christian mean to people? When someone says to us, 'here is Fred, Linda, Tom or Betty, and by the way, he or she is a Christian' - what do people expect of us? The name Christian will indicate someone whom we can rely on to tell the truth, who treats all people with respect and love, whose words we can trust, who is concerned with fairness and justice in our world and who lives by God's law. A Christian means a disciple of Christ, who follows the teaching of Christ and models his or her life after Jesus Christ.

because of these was characteristics that in acts 11:26. at Antioch, the disciples were first called CHRISTIAN because of how they loved one another and how they exhibited the sacrificial love of Christ. Quoting St. Augustine, our new Pope Leo XIV said, 'For you I am the Bishop of Rome but first I am a Christian like
